

TECHNOLOGY POLICY

Dear Parents of the Class of 2019,

I have received inquiries regarding the choice with a Chrome book or Macbook. After a year of researching what devices were best for our scholars and consulting with teachers on what devices would best work for the classroom, we agreed - a laptop was needed. Chrome books and Macbooks provide a range of apps and opportunities for students to learn about technology and through technology. The PMA Tech Team has received requests for debilitating viruses to be removed from other brands of PCs. Each PC has had over a thousand viruses. Chromebooks and Macbooks are less susceptible to viruses. They are actually the most proactive and secure devices for learning. All work and files are on the cloud; Google Drive.

Chrome books range from \$149-\$999 depending on features. The Macbooks range from \$999-\$3,200 depending on features. Both can do essentially the same things we want students to do in class.

Our current infrastructure is capable of handling devices and monitoring their activities online while at school. I will be conducting Tech Classes for parents in the future to match the tech skills your child is being taught. Make sure to sign up during the New Parent Meeting on August 13, 2015.
